Privacy Policy

This website, www.arville.com (our/the site) is operated by Arville Textiles Limited of Arville House, Sandbeck Way, Wetherby, Yorkshire LS22 7DQ 00493783 (we, us, our, the Company).

We are responsible for the processing of your personal data that may be provided to us and/or collected by us through the site and we are the data controller for all such data for the purposes of the General Data Protection Regulation (Regulation (EU) 2016/679) (GDPR).

We have developed this Privacy Policy so that you may feel confident about the privacy and security of your personal data. This Privacy Policy (together with the Terms of Use of the site and any other documents referred to in it) sets out the basis on which any personal data we collect from you, or that you provide to us, will be processed by us, the purpose of our collection of it and how we protect the data.

1. Data protection

As data controller, we take all necessary steps to comply with the GDPR, the Data Protection Principles set out in it and all relevant data protection laws applicable to our handling of personal data.

In accordance with the GDPR we are required to collect the data fairly and to inform you of the type of data we collect and how we will use it and whether we will pass the data on to any third parties.

Our approach and systems ensure that we take reasonable precautions to safeguard your personal data against loss and unauthorised disclosure or access.

2. The information we collect

We may collect and process the following data about you:

• information you provide to us when you submit information through the site (for example via an enquiry or contact form, or when you report a problem with our site), or by contacting us by phone, email or otherwise;

- information we collect about you when you use our site, including the Internet protocol (IP) address used to connect your computer to the Internet, your browser settings and information about your visit to our site (for example the pages on our site you visit, how you access and interact with them and information collected through cookies);

3. Why we process this information

We therefore have legitimate interests in processing your personal data in this way. When you provide us information for the purpose of placing an order, we will process your data to fulfil the order and to meet our contractual obligations in relation to that order. We will be unable to do this if you do not provide us the data we require to fulfil your order.

Unless you provide your consent we will not further process your name and email address to send you marketing information that you have not requested. Any consent that you provide can be withdrawn at any time. We will provide a clear method of doing so within our marketing communications, or you can inform us directly of your preferences by emailing us at sales@arville.com. Withdrawing your consent does not affect the lawfulness of any processing which occurred prior to the withdrawal of consent.

We may also use the information you supply to us and/or we collect about you:

- to monitor, support, improve and develop our service and to know which parts are of the most interest to you;
- to administer our site and associated technical purposes (for example, trouble shooting, data analysis and ensuring that content from the site is presented in an effective manner) and to help keep our site safe and secure; and
- to contact you for your views on our services and events and to notify you
 occasionally about important changes or developments to the site or our
 services.

We will keep your information for [6 years] and will delete it after that period if we no longer need the information or we are no longer required to keep it due to any legal requirements.

If we make any substantial change in the way in which we use your personal information (for example, as a result of a change in our business practices, processes, technology or the law) we will notify you by email and/or by updating this policy as appropriate.

4. Disclosure of your information

We may share your information with selected third parties, including:

- companies within our group (which means our subsidiary undertakings, our ultimate parent undertaking and its subsidiary undertakings, as defined in section 1162 of the UK Companies Act 2006);
- business partners, suppliers and sub-contractors who provide services to us, to enable us to perform our obligations under any contract we have entered into with you;

In addition, we may disclose your information to third parties:

in the event that we sell or buy any business or assets, in which case we may
disclose your personal data to the prospective seller or buyer of such
business or assets, or if Arville Textiles Limited or substantially all of its assets
are acquired by a third party (in which case personal data held by it about its
customers will be one of the transferred assets); or

where we are required to forward the information in order to comply with a regulatory or legal process or in order to enforce or apply our Terms of Use or other contractual obligations or to protect the rights, property, or safety of Arville Textiles Limited, our customers, or others.

5. How we protect your data

We will take all steps reasonably necessary to ensure that your data is treated securely and in accordance with this privacy policy. All information that we collect and hold through our site is stored and backed-up on secured servers and we use procedures and security features to try to prevent unauthorised access.

While we take care to ensure the security of the site and of your personal information from access by unauthorised persons and against unlawful processing, accidental loss, destruction and damage, unfortunately the transmission of information online is not completely secure.

Although we will do our best to protect your personal data, we cannot guarantee the security of your data transmitted to or collected through our site; any transmission is at your own risk.

6. Use of Cookies

By using our site we will use cookies to distinguish you from other users of our site. A cookie is a small file which is sent to your browser and stored on your computer's hard disc and helps us to provide our site to you and understand your use of the site. This information helps us to improve our site and your user experience.
